When teachers have voice they are




more likely to value setting goals and work hard to reach those goals.

more likely to encourage students to be leaders and make decisions!


However...

59% of teachers are comfortable expressing their honest opinions and concerns.







48% of teachers believe they have the skills to effectively communicate in their school.







