

Bringing a Geography team into the 21st century and growing a positive growth mind set was my first challenge as the new subject leader of Geography.

I set about incorporating a range of the thinking tools into the everyday practice of meetings and lesson delivery.

The biggest challenge was to change the fixed mind sets and convince a teaching team that there are other more innovative methods of teaching than simply textbook.

I trained both staff and students in the use of the de Bono Thinking Hats to help lead more constructive meetings and to aid teaching and learning so that they were more engaging and fun.

Students are now confident in the use of the Thinking Hats and this is evident in progress and attainment.

In thinking lessons the teacher has to be firmly in charge of the class.

Lessons are designed to provide the basic outline of a thinking course which treats thinking as a direct skill.

Thinking lessons can only be as good as the teacher who teaches them.

Teachers have to learn how to use the tools. It is difficult to ride a bike until you learn how.



The basic principles underlying the tools are:

Thinking is a skill which can be developed.

Most practical thinking takes place in the perception stage.

The tools method is used to teach thinking.






Each thinking puts forward thoughts in parallel with the thoughts of others-without attacking or judging. It allows cooperative exploration instead of adversarial confrontation.




