


Q1 - How well have we communicated with you about Covid-19 up to this point?


Q2 - How frequently do you like us to communicate with you?








Q8 - How comfortable are you with the travel arrangements for your child to get to school?


Q9 - It is likely that the numbers of children attending school will gradually increase. If your child is offered a place, would you want them to attend school?


Q10 - I understand the way the school works may be different on the return.


Q11 - My child is able to understand social distancing.


Q12 - I understand that social distancing is not always possible at school and agree that there are risks attached to this.
